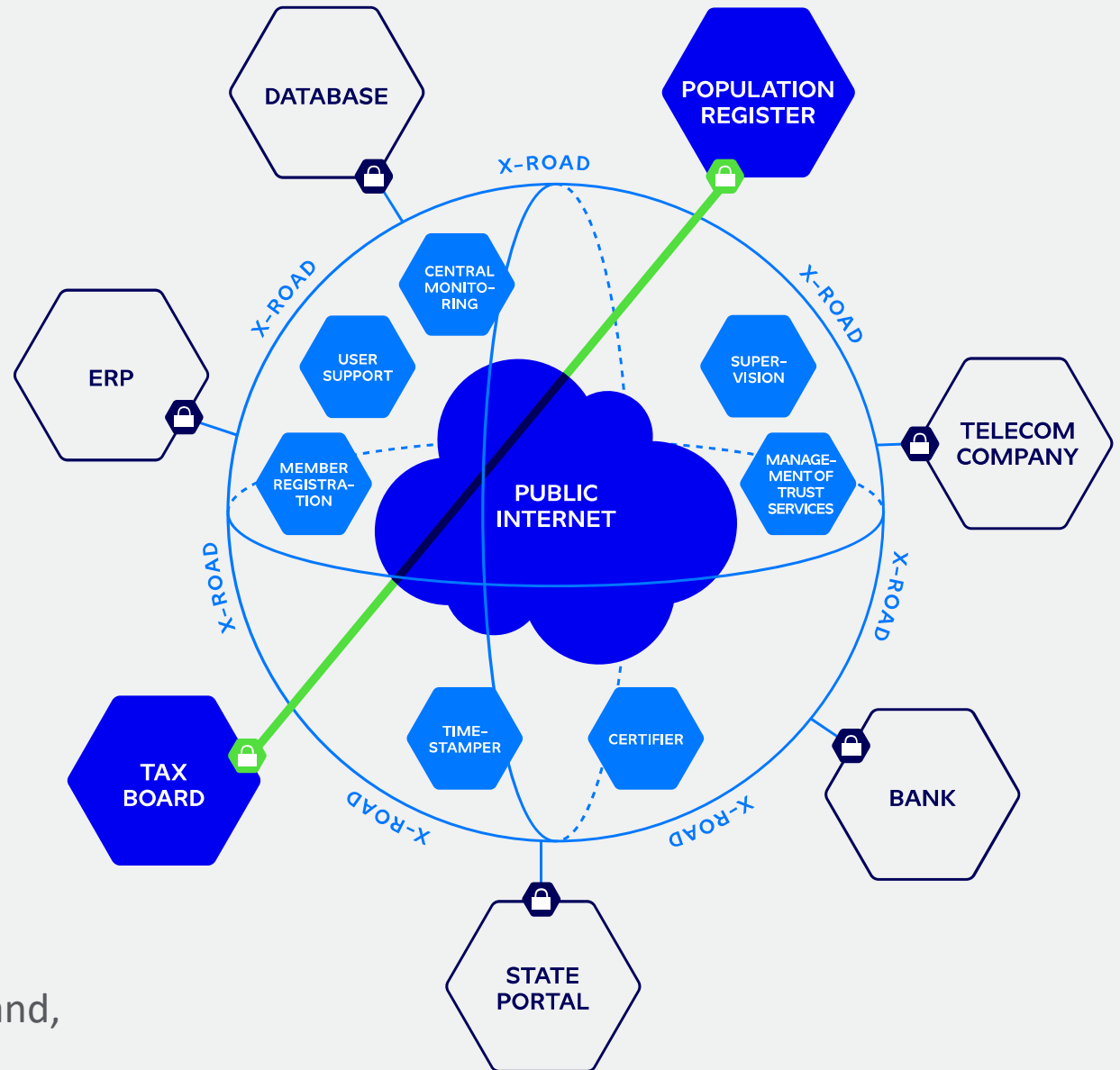

- + State Secrets and Classified Information of Foreign States Act

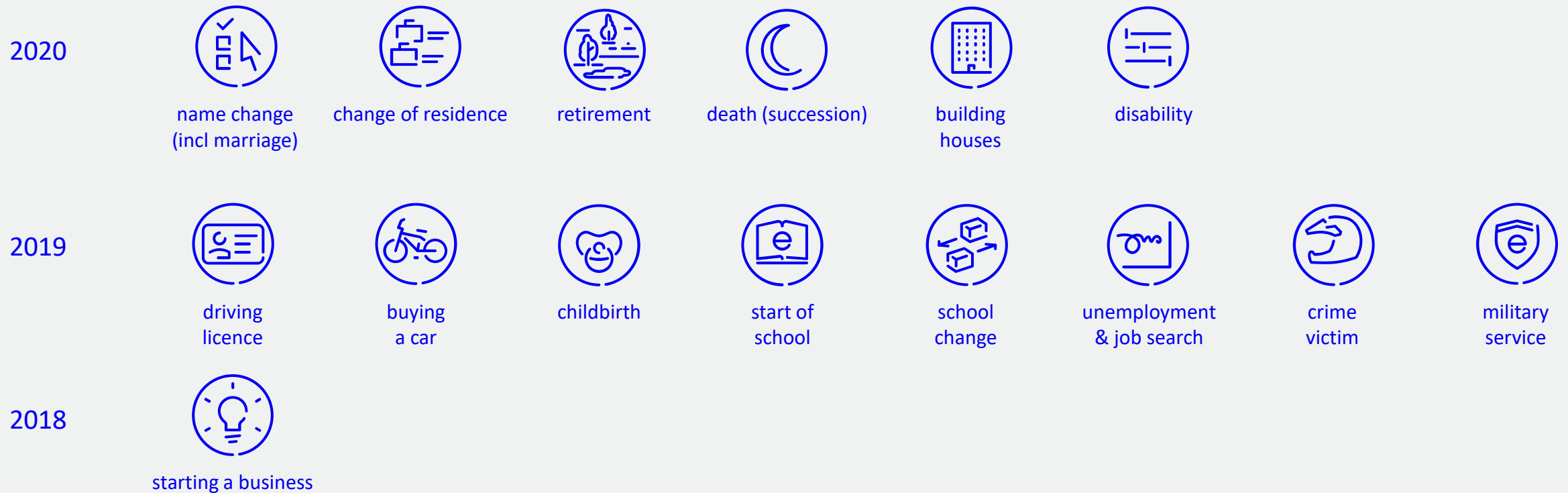

lessons learned

- + KISS - keep it short and simple;
- + Start by solving citizens simple problems with IT;
- + Do the same things together, it is cheaper and more sustainable (local governments have to work together because the responsibilities of local governments are essentially the same);
- + Use open source. Licensed solutions will bind you for years and are expensive;
